

ATV rental regulations

1. The driver of the vehicle must have a valid driver's license.
2. Only two passengers are allowed on the ATV. Quads are not designed to carry more than two people as it could cause a loss of vehicle control, rollover, a collision, or completely expel passengers from the vehicle.
3. Based on the traffic law, children under 5 cannot be transported as passengers.
4. Do not drink Alcohol if you are driving. ATValerios does not allow or accept the rental of any vehicle under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages.
5. Helmets and reflectors are included in the rental package. They are a mandatory requirement to drive the vehicles.
6. Additional equipment must be handled with care not to damage it:
 - Do not leave the helmets in the sand
 - Do not let helmets fall against the ground.
 - Do not place unused helmets in the drawers of the vehicle since they can be damaged during the trip.
7. The vehicle is rented with a full tank of fuel. The customer must return it in the same way. Avoid additional charges.
8. Avoid reckless driving such as participating in races or sprints, lifting the quad on two tires and avoid spinning or skidding the vehicle. It is important to mention that there is a possibility that the quad would tip over towards the driver if it is handled improperly.
9. Avoid speeding. Drive slowly in hollow, rocky, or paved areas. Excessive speed can cause you to lose control of your vehicle, causing a rollover, a collision, or being thrown out of it. The vehicles have tires for dirt roads or ballast so they are not suitable on the pavement.
10. The speed limit in Santa Teresa is 25 KPH. On roads where there are no speed signs, the limit is 60 KPH.
11. Don't drive on the beach. Stay away from salt water and sand. Loose sandbars or dunes can cause your vehicle to stop suddenly. Salt water is very corrosive to electrical parts and can cause the vehicle to stop due to an electrical short circuit. Salt sand corrodes metallic finishes of the vehicle, you may be charged for these damages. The fee for driving on the beach and signs of salt corrosion is at least \$ 350. So, avoid driving on the beach.
12. Vehicle maintenance is done before each rental. Therefore, it is important to
 - Make sure the tires look properly inflated, 4 to 4.5 pounds of pressure.
 - Check fuel and coolant levels and carefully top up if necessary. Do not let sand or water get into these tanks.
 - Let the cold engine warm up for 5 minutes before starting your route.

- Do not heat the engine with strong accelerations since the oil and the components of the vehicle have not reached the ideal temperature yet.
- AVOID EXCESSIVE USE OF THE ENGINE. Turn off the ATV occasionally to let it to cool down while parked.
- Do not try to wash or clean the ATVs before the end of their rental period. Trying to clean sand off ATVs can scratch the vehicle. At ATValerios we wash off the sand from the vehicle as we do our final inspection.
- It is worth mentioning that the salt cleaning fee is \$ 350.

13. It is important to take into consideration that the ATVs do not have damage insurance. This is why customers are responsible for all damages caused to the rented ATV as well as all other vehicles involved in a possible accident, in addition to all bodily injuries and property of third parties.

14. If you are involved in an accident with a third party, contact the owner of the vehicles. If necessary, call the authorities and exchange information about your insurance company.

15. We appreciate in advance that you always inform us about all damages, losses or incidents. Do not leave the rented vehicle unattended. The renter is responsible for the vehicle at all times and any damage or loss of the ATV or equipment will be charged to the main party's credit card listed in the rental agreement. Our full inspection is 72 hours maximum after the vehicle is returned.

16. Customers are responsible for flat tires caused by driving too fast or aggressively over rocky areas. At ATValerios we are not responsible for lost rental time due to flat tires.

17. Assistance for inadvertently running out of fuel in the middle of the road, a flat tire or accident, is added as an additional charge to the renter of the vehicle.

18. Driving is allowed only within the Nicoya Peninsula and according to following limits: The northwestern the limit is town of Manzanillo and in the extreme south is Tambor town.

19. Avoid crossing rivers in the rainy season. If it has rained for several hours, avoid crossing any river by vehicle or walking, and stay away from the current, since you could be swept away.
